Maria Cwiertniewicz (Poland), 4th place Kayak, Olympic Games 1972:

"These World Championships are a dream. Everything is just right here, from the organisation to the sporting events to the atmosphere created by the many spectators. I'm also lucky enough to be able to celebrate my birthday here, just like I did in 1972. For me, the World Championships in Augsburg are number one in the world."
